Managing the TEP Patient: A Practical Workshop

This course is a “hands-on” workshop designed to give speech-language pathologists the opportunity to learn how to place and remove the prosthesis used for TEP speech. In addition, the course will cover the history of the prosthesis, surgical procedures, management of complications, heat and moisture exchangers (HME’s), tracheostoma valves, buttons and swallowing issues. The course will facilitate the development and refinement of clinical skills for managing this patient population.
