The Stanford Center for Sleep Sciences and Medicine is searching for 3 faculty members at the Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Full Professor level in the Medical Center Line, Non-Tenure Line (Research), or the University Tenure Line to conduct clinical care, teaching, and research in the field of Sleep Medicine. Candidates with an M.D., Ph.D., or equivalent degree and a strong record of research accomplishment are encouraged to apply. Primary and secondary departmental affiliations are flexible and will be tailored for the successful candidates. Duties will consist of 1) conducting research in basic sleep research or clinical sleep disorders medicine, 2) teaching and mentorship, and 3) for appropriately qualified candidates, clinical work in the area of sleep medicine, preferentially with a subspecialty in sleep apnea, insomnia, restless leg syndrome, hypersomnia, parasomnia or other sleep disorders.

The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill.

The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching.

The major criterion for appointment for faculty in the Non-Tenure Line (Research) is evidence of high-level performance as a researcher for whose special knowledge a programmatic need exists.
